

\* IRIDESCE - The Living Apology Workshop June 9 1:30-4:30pm Eastminster United Church- Hurndale Room

In 1988, The United Church of Canada did something historic when it voted not to exclude gay and lesbian (and, a little later) bisexual, trans and 2-Spirit people in full participation and ministry in the Church. Before, then and now... how welcoming has our welcome been? On June 9, you are invited to learn, remember and share about this important time in our history.

The Iridesce workshop is a compassionate and engaging time to learn, share and respond, regarding "the issue" of the United Church's 1988 vote. This was a vote not to exclude those who are lesbian, gay (and later, bi and trans) from membership and from being eligible for ministry in our church. This is a process of faith and healing from these times — all stories from all sides of "the issue" are welcome and need to be preserved for our church, and all of us, to heal, as we consider the need for making an apology as a national sign of reconciliation with people who are gay, lesbian, bi and transgender. Our goal is to have brave conversations and becoming a stronger church together.

The workshop is a safe-space to share and be heard, or to simply listen and be present. We hope you can join us!

On Sunday June 10 the worship service at Eastminster, will feature a sermon reflection by the Iridesce coordinator, Aaron Miechkota.

Book this month: The Readers of Broken Wheel Recommend by Katarina Bivald Available at the library in all formats: books, ebook, eAudiobook, audiobook CD, and CD Talking Book. A book set in Iowa yet written by a Swedish author! It begins with a correspondence between two quite different women: 28-year-old Sara from Haninge, Sweden, and 65-year-old Amy from the small town of Broken Wheel, Iowa. After years of exchanging books, letters and thoughts on the meaning of literature and life, Sara travels from Sweden to visit her pen pal. When she arrives, however, she finds Amy's house empty; the funeral guests are just heading home! Sara is now alone. And what choice do the inhabitants of Broken Wheel have but to take care of their bewildered tourist? And what choice does Sara have, faced with a town where nobody reads yet she desires to honour her friend, but to set up the perfect bookshop with all the books she and Amy shared? And then watch as the townsfolk are, one by one, transformed in unexpected ways. In the glorious tradition of 84 Charing Cross Road and The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society, this is a big-hearted, witty book about books, friendship, love (and romance). Primarily it's about being open to the unexpected!
